We had an exciting line up of guests in this month's *Praise the Lord* programs!



The school is only two miles from our station and we have done some community outreach there and they have appreciated it so much.

City Rescue Mission of Oklahoma City has a wonderful facility and different programs for the homeless. One of the great programs is called The Bridge to Life. To stay for any period of time at City Rescue Mission a person needs to participate in this program., which is educational and preparing the person to find a job and eventually be able to support themselves and move on in their life. They have separate facilities for men and women and families. One of the latest needs at the Mission was diapers and baby wipes which we purchased and delivered for our community outreach project.
