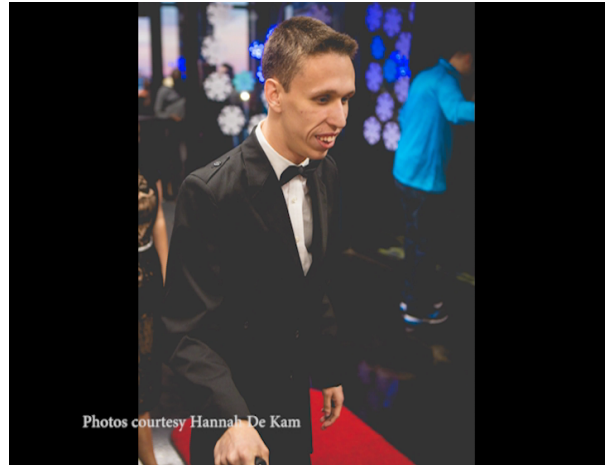


Johnette Cruz appeared on *Joy in Our Town* to talk about the event and what all is done for the individuals participating in the event besides the night of the Prom.



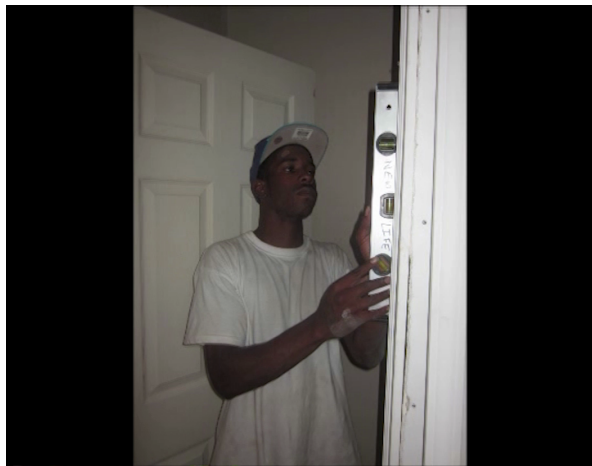
