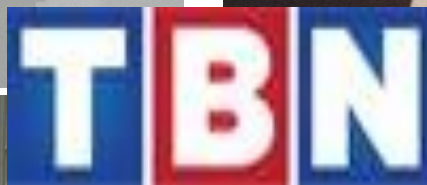

James Laura, Jr. discussed that a structured competitive environment is what makes a person ready for the work place. "We had a high school football team that we helped to meet some goals, and the leadership of that team tells us the results were a product of our support, giving the team members a sense of self assurance and worth" he explained. "We recommend internship programs that help our youth learn the experience they need to work as a team in the real world."

Jerry Folse, of the Mobile County Health Department talked about the problems of mosquitoes in our area. "We control mosquitoes and also rodents, because they are bringing diseases," he explained. "Most people did not take these precautions seriously until diseases began to be the threat. We educate the public about how to take precautions on their own property, like removing containers that can hold standing water, and wear repellents." He said that the Zika virus can cause birth defects, and some people seem to be taking more precautions.
