


Caroline Lusk interviewing Steve Green as Shirley Caesar, Steve Green, and Danny Gokey. Each artist shared how they

Hope Loftis hosted several programs that included interviews with Dr. Ming Wang (Wang Foundation), Pamela Russo (Catholic Charities of Tennessee), Steve Norris and Eric Evans (4:13 Strong organization), and Marcus Meneese and Derrick Redmond (Stronger Than My Pamela Russo

Father organization). Dr. Wang shared about his background, schooling and eventually what drove him to be an eye surgeon. Dr. Wang's life story was also one of those chronicled in Dr. Rice Broocks' *God's Not Dead* book and movie (Dr. Martin Yip). One of the services Dr. Wang's foundation offers is to help the poor who were blind and attempt to help them regain their sight by offering free sight restoration to those in need and cannot afford treatment. The Wang Foundation has helped patients from forty U.S. states and fifty-five countries around the world. Dr. Wang shared a moving story of one individual he was able to help. Steve Norris and Eric Evans shared about their organization, which helps men who may be considered "at risk" and who are referred to the program by attorneys or

judges to find structure in their lives. They go through a six month program, and each individual must try out to be accepted, which basically lets the directors know whether an individual really does want to change and leave the life of destruction that they know or not. Those who are accepted into the program learn life skills, attend a Bible Study, learn financial management, attend work study classes, etc... They are always looking for volunteers. Marcus Meneese and Derrick Redmond teach children morals and values at an early age or simply letting the children learn their God-given purpose. Their ministry started out as a mentoring program, but they have grown into an after school program where the child is helped to stay on the right life path. Many times a child in their program does not learn proper guidance at home, so their only example is in this program. Pamela Russo shared the many outreach programs that they have to help the less fortunate. From teaching sewing classes to handing out meals; housing to counseling, and so many other areas in between, Catholic Charities of Tennessee offers so much for Middle Tennessee residents in need!
