Speaking Out! TBN/WRBJ-TV has had the one of the most exciting months ever as we connect with ministries reaching out to all citizens of Mississippi. The John and Vera May Perkins Foundation, Palmer Home for Children, Pete Carullo Construction Ministries, and networking groups like Maids and Matrons, and Mission Mississippi are incredible examples of this.

WRBJ attended Reverend John Perkins' large monthly dinner where community leaders throughout Jackson convene at the foundation's campus to discuss progress in church and race relations, and to enjoy a meal together. Mississippi is profoundly pro-life as evidenced by strong backing from the Legislature, Voters, and our Christian Governor to draw attention to this issue and close the state's last clinic devoted solely to abortions. The Capitol rotunda was the scene of a large prayer gathering on January 21st, followed by a reception at St. Peter's Cathedral to address the issue of abortion.

TBN/WRBJ-TV taped a new interview with Terri Herring, long time pro-life activist who now works with Choose Life Mississippi. This networking organization serves as an information center for any girl or woman faced with an unplanned pregnancy. More and more pastors and volunteers are coming forward to speak out and make abortion nonexistent in Mississippi.





JOY IN OUR TOWN







New Joy in Our Town programs were taped in January with guests Miranda Beard, President of the National School Boards Association which oversees over 50,000,000 schoolchildren; Reverend Jerry Durr of Brookhaven Outreach to the homeless; Dr. Freda Bush, physician and sexual abstinence counselor; Wendy Seals of Angel Wings food bank; and Tina Hayward of Mountain of Faith ministry to homeless women and children in Warren County.

Another key Joy in Our Town interview was with Susie Harvill, founder of Advocates for Freedom, which works to stop child sex trafficking in our state. This hidden evil lends itself to Mississippi's geographic location and its high transient population.





The children who are fortunate enough to find refuge and protection receive assistance from Drake Bassett, former New York business executive and director of Palmer Home for Children; Del Herrington of Mustard Seed ministry; Catholic Charities; and dozens of shelters and orphanages that assist in freeing children from abuse.

WRBJ is always searching across central Mississippi to find organizations, churches, ministries, and individuals who are actively doing the work Jesus commissions us to do! MAJOR ISSUES IN THE MID-MISSISSIPPI AREA

A series of devastating storms with multiple tornados ripped through southeast Mississippi in late January. The Mississippi hub city of Hattiesburg was hit with maximum force causing a number of deaths. William Carey University, a Christian campus located within our broadcasting area, sustained extensive damage but miraculously no deaths. The moving image of a garden statue of Jesus next to the damaged school buildings (below) illustrates the total trust which we can place in Him.
